Recycled Material Art Sculpture Contest

Who? Any student from 9th to 12th grade is eligible to participate. One student name per sculpture please.

What? High school students are challenged to create large format sculpture piece out of recyclable materials to make public art in a way that makes a statement about the environment. The sculpture should have an environmental or earth friendly theme.

Where? The Grand Winners of NVEF 2018 Earth Day Poster Contest will be honored Saturday, April 21, 2018 at Northern Valley Regional Demarest High School, Demarest, NJ as part of our Earth Day Celebration!

When? All original entries must be submitted by April 21, 2018 for judging by 10AM. Award presentation will take place on Saturday, April 21, 2018 at our Earth Day Celebration at 1PM.

Final Grand winners will be announced at the NVEF 2018 Fair at 1PM.

Rules?

1. All rules are created by the 2018 Northern Valley Earth Fair Sculpture Contest Committee and all rulings by that committee are final.
2. Sculptures should be conceived as large outdoor pieces. This can mean that it consists of one large piece, several smaller pieces that are grouped together or many small pieces that are assembled as a field of items for a wider overall effect.
3. Sculptures must be transported to the site, Northern Valley Regional Demarest High School, Demarest, NJ, on the day of the event and easily removed once the event is over. The artist(s) is responsible for the transportation, set up and removal of the piece on the day of the event. You will not be allowed to dispose of the sculpture on site.
4. Sculptures should be constructed of all or mostly all recyclable materials. If there is a need for a frame or if materials to connect things together aren't completely recyclable that is ok. Be aware that the amount of recyclable materials used is a criterion for judging so a piece that is constructed completely out of recycled materials will receive more points than one that contains some materials that are not recyclable.
5. The theme can be supported by additional materials that the participant can choose to have on display alongside the sculpture. These can include but are not limited to sketches,
6. The judging will be based on criteria including
 - Amount of recycled materials used
 - Creativity and ingenuity
 - How well the piece represents the intended theme
 - Execution and craft

Ideas of Materials for Recycled Sculpture Project (Feel free to come up with your own)

- bottles/cans/bottle caps
- styrofoam

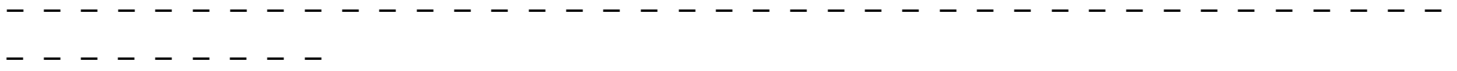
- wire
- CD' s (as many as possible)
- plastic bags
- chicken wire
- bubble wrap
- old clothes/rags
- cardboard
- gum wrappers
- PVC tubes

7. Any additional materials for should be submitted to the Sculpture contest committee for approval prior to their display.
8. The participant should create a title for the piece and display a sign on site with the title of the piece, the name of the artist(s) and the theme so that the public and the judges can tell which piece is yours.
9. Chosen entries will then email the Northern Valley Earth Fair at nvearthfair@yahoo.com, by Friday April 13th, stating their name, email, phone number, home town, high school, title of piece and approximate dimensions of the piece. This is also to reserve space for sculpture.
10. The artist(s) will be asked to stand by their pieces during a specified time period during the event to offer comments and explanations of their work to the judges and the public. That schedule will be supplied to all participants prior to the event.
